



JUAN GUERRA GONZÁLEZ

Juan Guerra González, a composer, conductor, and pianist born in 1980 in El Salvador, Central America, commenced his musical education at the tender age of four under the guidance of his mother. Subsequently, he pursued piano studies with Dr. Joseph Karl Doetsch and composition with Dr. Ivette Herryman in New York City, where he has resided since 2009.

Guerra's passion for the profound emotional impact of music is evident in his compositions. His works have garnered critical acclaim for fostering deep connections between listeners and performers.

In 2021, Guerra's String Quartet No. 1, titled "Migrando..." was awarded first prize in the "Sonidos de la Diáspora" composition competition. Additionally, his composition "Munamiktia" secured second place in the Pan American Symphony Orchestra composition competition "Ciudades Hermanas" in 2019. Notably, "Healing," a piece composed during the COVID-19 pandemic quarantine, and other works by Guerra are available for streaming on all major streaming platforms.

Guerra is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP).
