Colombian violinist Dr. Mauricio Oliveros is a multifaceted musician with a vast experience as a soloist, recitalist, chamber musician, arranger, improviser, and educator. He serves as Concertmaster of the Symphony of Southeast Texas while holding faculty positions at Houston Christian University, The Kinkaid School, and the Tallowood Academy of Fine Arts. He performs regularly throughout the American Continent, and has appeared as soloist with several orchestras in his native country and in America. He has also collaborated with internationally acclaimed Latino artists such as Paquito D'Rivera, Alexis Cardenas, Eddy Marcano, Baden Goyo, Hector Molina, and Cecilia Duarte. An avid lover of chamber music, he is a co-founder member and arranger of the Terra Nostra Ensemble and the Ossia Trio.

As an educator, Dr. Oliveros continues to build and recruit for his studio at Houston Christian University and enjoys teaching middle and high school children at The Kinkaid School and the Tallowood Academy of Fine Arts. His students have won competitions in the Houston area and regularly earn placements in the TMEA Region and All State orchestras, as well as the local youth orchestras. He has also given violin masterclasses in the USA, Colombia, Cuba, Peru, Mexico, and Uruguay.
